## Holy Gospel

Mark 7:1–13

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the seventh chapter.

C **Glory to You, O Lord.**

<sup>1</sup>When the Pharisees gathered to [Jesus], with some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem, <sup>2</sup>they saw that some of his disciples ate with hands that were defiled, that is, unwashed. <sup>3</sup>(For the Pharisees and all the Jews do not eat unless they wash their hands, holding to the tradition of the elders, <sup>4</sup>and when they come from the marketplace, they do not eat unless they wash. And there are many other traditions that they observe, such as the washing of cups and pots and copper vessels and dining couches.) <sup>5</sup>And the Pharisees and the scribes asked him, “Why do your disciples not walk according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?” <sup>6</sup>And he said to them, “Well did Isaiah prophesy of you hypocrites, as it is written,

“‘This people honors me with their lips,

but their heart is far from me;

<sup>7</sup>in vain do they worship me,

teaching as doctrines the commandments of men.’”

<sup>8</sup>You leave the commandment of God and hold to the tradition of men.”

<sup>9</sup>And he said to them, “You have a fine way of rejecting the commandment of God in order to establish your tradition! <sup>10</sup>For Moses said, ‘Honor your father and your mother’; and, ‘Whoever reviles father or mother must surely die.’ <sup>11</sup>But you say, ‘If a man tells his father or his mother, Whatever you would have gained from me is Corban’ (that is, given to God)— <sup>12</sup>then you no longer permit him to do anything for his father or mother, <sup>13</sup>thus making void the word of God by your tradition that you have handed down. And many such things you do.”

*Creed [“Creed” comes from the Latin credo, which means “I believe.” From the time of Pentecost, the Ancient Christian Church has confessed a creed. The Early Christian Church has always believed, taught, and confessed these Scriptural teachings. This is why we are called a Creedal Church.] (Us men means all people)*

**Prayer Partners- Is Now “Partners in Prayer” or PIPs for short!** We are looking forward to beginning **PIPs** in **September**. **Pictures will be posted** in the **Narthex** by next **Sunday** of all the students. If you already know who you would like, be sure to let **the office** know as soon as possible. Once pictures are up, there will be a **signup sheet** in the **Narthex**.

If you are not familiar with the program, students are chosen by congregation members to pray for throughout the year. PIPs also **have lunch together one Friday a month** called **Lunch Bunch**. If you know you can't attend lunch, please choose a preschooler.

**Luke 2 Shirts-** Christmas is right around the corner. **We want to be prepared to start conversations about Jesus** during the month of December (and anytime). **We will be taking orders** for Luke 2 shirts after church during **August and part of September**. The shirts will arrive by the end of **November**. **DCE Jonathan and Arliss Bridget** were in a Zoom meeting with the Luke2Project. They heard a story about Duane Danner. He has a terminal disease. Doctors have turned his life over to Jesus. There is nothing more the doctors can do. But Duane isn't leaving this world without proclaiming the Gospel as much as he can. When someone comes up to him and says, "I love your shirt," he replies with "So you love it... would you wear it?" Duane carries Luke2 shirts in his trunk so that he may give away a shirt to anyone who would like one. It's called the **Danner Dozen**. (Even though he may have more than a dozen shirts in his car.) Would you be willing to join the **Danner Dozen team**? Reality is a dozen shirts are a lot of money. Would you be willing to buy even **one or two extras**? Or, would you be willing to donate a few extra dollars to Messiah to have a stack of shirts available? Please see **DCE Jonathan** or one of the **youths after worship** to place your order. **Arliss Bridget** is going to be making the rounds to other churches to spread the word about Luke 2. Keep watch for Luke 24 The Easter Story in the spring.

**Handbells & Choir-** Are both having rehearsals on **Thurs. at 6:15 & 7pm** respectively, beginning this week. Both groups are always looking for new members.

**Sunday Dinners at Four Winds Coffee Shop-** The fall semester at CMU has begun. Four Winds Coffee Shop at the **corner of 12th and Bookcliff** needs **churches to volunteer** to serve dinner to college students. The dinner is free. Four Winds provides drinks, plates and utensils. Churches provide food and volunteers. Last year, Messiah provided two dinners in the fall and two more in the spring. We need **a point person** to coordinate the food (not make it, but put a list of needs together for others to donate), people to help serve the night of the dinner and people to mingle with the students. Last year, we had about four volunteers each time. **It would be great to increase that to six**, so we have volunteers available to mingle with the college students, get to know them, ask them if they have any prayer requests and generally make them feel at home in Grand Junction. **Are you able to volunteer for one of these dinners?** Contact **DCE Jonathan** with questions. Dinners begin **August 25th** and go through **December 8th** (taking November 24th off). **Which two dinners should Messiah provide in the Fall semester?**

**Battle Ready** - with new group names! Battle Ready will resume on Sunday **September 8th** for **Modules** and Monday **September 9th** for **World Religion & Denominations**. **Please note the new names!** 7th/8th grade Battle Ready is now called **Modules**. 9th/10th grade Battle Ready is now **World Religion & Denominations**. 5th/6th grade will be called **Red Catechism**. All under the category of *Battle Ready*!
