

Reflection & Discussion Questions

Theme: *This Is Just What We Do—Praying People in a Hurting World*

1. **What's the point of prayer—especially when it feels like nothing changes?**

If prayer isn't just about getting what we want, could it be about staying connected to Someone who loves us even when the world doesn't make sense (Luke 11:1–13)?

2. **What does Abraham's back-and-forth with God teach us about how we're allowed to speak to Him?**

Do you think God actually invites us to be bold, honest, and even persistent in prayer (Genesis 18:20–33)? Why or why not?

3. **How does it change things to believe that God sees you, values you, and has a purpose for you—even when others overlook you?**

Psalm 138 says God “regards the lowly.” When have you felt unseen? What if you believed God never missed a moment of your story?

4. **What's shaping your identity most right now—and is it helping or hurting?**

Colossians 2 talks about being “rooted and built up in Christ.” What does it mean to have your foundation in something eternal instead of in trends, pressure, or other people’s opinions?

5. **If you could ask God for one thing right now—and knew He was listening—what would it be?**

Have you stopped praying about something because you felt unheard or disappointed? What would it take to pray again?
